

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – MAIN PAVILION

1. All exhibitors must abide by the **General Regulations for Mudgee Show** and the **Conditions of Entry - Main Pavilion**.
2. All exhibits must be the original work of the Exhibitor & have been completed in the past 12 months.
3. A NOVICE Exhibitor is a competitor who has not won a Champion exhibit at Dunedoo, Gulgong, Mudgee or Rylstone Shows. Once an Exhibitor has won a championship in the Novice division of any class they shall in future compete in the respective Open classes of those sections. The Chief Steward is obligated to reassign an entry to its correct class if incorrectly entered and the mistake is brought to her/his attention.
4. Open & novice exhibits in the ART section must be framed or mounted ready to hang.
5. In the JUNIOR COMPUTER GRAPHIC ART category entries will only be accepted on A4 size or smaller paper.
6. Black & Coloured Wool – fleeces may be delivered to the Mudgee Show Office or taken to the Main Pavilion. All fleeces are to be of 12 months growth & lightly skirted. Belly wool is not to be included
7. All exhibits in the COOKING section are to be baked in a 20cm round or square tin, unless otherwise specified & displayed on a plastic or cardboard plate.
8. CALLIGRAPHY exhibits must be framed or mounted ready to hang.
9. Exhibits in the FARM & GARDEN section may be cut by the Judge.
10. All exhibits in JAMS & JELLIES classes in the HOME PRODUCE section must be displayed in jars of at least 110gm
11. Frames of honey entered in the HONEY section are to be displayed in glass or covered with cellophane.
12. Exhibits in the HONEY section are to be displayed in 500g jars
13. Each entry in the HOME BREW section is to consist of two unlabelled standard bottles - one for display & one to be opened for judging.
14. The Pavilion will open at 8am Friday for staging exhibits. All exhibits MUST BE STAGED by 10.30am to allow judging to commence at 11.00am. Containers will be provided for cut flowers. NND means the same cultivar. HORTICULTURE must be grown by the Exhibitor except in Decorative classes.
15. Articles entered in the NEEDLE & FANCY-WORK section must not have been washed.
16. Skeins of hand spun wool entered in the SPINNING & WEAVING section must weigh a minimum of 50g.
17. For hand spun fibre entered in the SPINNING & WEAVING section, you must state intended use (e.g. adult or child's garment) & attach a sample of the fibres used.
18. The determination of class entry is at the discretion of the Chief Steward.

ENTRY CLOSING DATES

ENTRIES in all Main Pavilion Sections close 5pm

Monday 1st March 2010, except the following sections: Woodworking, Cookery, Farm & Garden and Horticulture.

Under SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES late entries will be accepted up until 12 noon Tuesday 2nd March.

ENTRIES in the following sections close at 5.00pm

Thursday 4th March: Woodworking, Cookery and Farm & Garden.

ENTRIES in Horticulture close by 10.00am Friday 5th March

COLLECTION OF ENTRIES

Exhibits may be collected after the Show from the Main Pavilion on Sunday 7th March from 10 am to 12 noon.

NOTE: Any perishable items e.g. farm produce, fruit, cooking not collected on Sunday 7th March will be disposed of. Any other items not collected on Sunday 7th March will be stored in the Show Society Office. Pick up of uncollected exhibits is to be organised by their owners with the Show Secretary at a mutually convenient time. Any items not collected by the end of the month (Wednesday 31st March) will be disposed of or donated to charity at the discretion of the Show Secretary.

ENTRY FEE

\$1 per exhibit maximum charge of \$10 per person.

There will not be any charge for Aged or Disability Pensioners or for Junior entries. All Children's or Junior Classes will be in School Years not Ages.

PRIZE MONEY

For all classes will be 1st - \$5, unless otherwise specified.

A special prize of \$100 cash for the Best Overall Exhibit in the Main Pavilion will be awarded in Open and Junior Classes.
